Plots soon in Rs 180-cr

spiring entrepreneurs wanting to set up various facilities Lin the Rs 179.5-crore Mega Food Park, being set up by HAFED in IMT, Rohtak, will soon be allotted plots through the auction route.

The HSIIDC would soon cobble together its outreach plan and set rolling the process for the auction of plots. Work is apace on the food park being set up over 50 acres, the project management contract for which has been awarded to Schoolnet India Ltd, earlier known as IL&FS.

Proportionate expenditure of Rs 16.14 crore on laying such basic enabling infrastructure as roads, sewerage, streetlights etc., has already been made on the project for which the Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MOFPI), Government of India, has granted Rs 50-crore grant-in-aid.

Outlining details of the project, Mr Sanjeev Kaushal, ACS, Financial Commissioner, Revenue, told Haryana Review that the five-acre processing area of the core processing centre shall have the following types and number of plots: Type A - 450 Sq. Mt.(38); Type B 1,012.5 Sq. Mt.

(20); Type C 1,800 Sq. Mt.(17); and Type D 4,050 Sq. Mt. (5). The allotment process will be initiated soon.

While the core processing centre of the project would be located at IMT Rohtak (Phase III), its primary processing centres would be

spread over three locations in as many districts: Manakpur (Yamunanagar), Bawal (Rewari) and Narwana (Jind).

The total project cost of Rs 179.75 crore is proposed to be financed by HAFED Rs 74.75 crore

(41.59 pc) ;grant from the MOFPI Rs 50.27 crore (27.81 pc); and term loan of Rs 55.30 crore (30.6 pc) from NABARD.

The HSIIDC will transfer land for the food park on freehold basis to HAFED without any upfront payment. It would be responsible for its marketing and would take all necessary steps to work out a proper outreach plan for the sale of plots.

On completion, HAFED would transfer the project to HSIIDC along with assets, liabilities and operations. HAFED shall be entitled to 2 per cent of the project cost as administrative charges before transfer of this project to the HSIIDC, Mr Kaushal said.

The core processing facilities being set up at the park include a multipurpose cold storage of 5,000 MT capacity; IQF-1.5 MT/hr; deep freeze facility of 1,500 MT; raw material/finished goods warehouse 7,500 MT; silos 2,500 MT; steam generation-2 MT/hr; food testing lab and four sheds.

These are besides 500-MT warehouse; 1.5-MT/ hr sorting and grading yard; 500-MT cold storage; 10,000-LPD Milk Chilling Unit; 10-MT milk storage facility; and 300-MT cold storage.



Harvana to develop tourist hubs on Sarasvati River

In order to give a boost to religious tourism, the Haryana Government has decided to develop Pipli in Kurukshetra district as a world-class tourist hub on the Sarasvati Setu to attract tourists from within the country and abroad.

Coupled with Adi Badri in Yamunanagar, the starting point of river Sarasvati on the planes, it is expected to place Haryana on the international tourist map.

The task of developing the two places as tourism hubs has been entrusted to the Haryana Sarasvati Heritage Development Board (HSHDB). Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal, who is chairman of the Board, approved the proposal at a meeting held recently.

The tourist hub in Pipli would offer facilities like boating, restaurants, parks, museums etc to the visitors. The chief minister has also directed that five-six water ties in the area but also improve the

Rehabilitate slum dwellers: CM

While taking forward the vision of Prime Minister, Mr Narendra Modi, to ensure Housing for All by 2022, the Chief Minister has directed officials to prepare a comprehensive scheme for the rehabilitation of urban slums in the state by providing residential flats to the slum dwellers at affordable prices. To begin with, Faridabad and Gurugram are proposed to be taken up under the scheme.

Presiding over a meeting on "Housing for All', he said that subsequently, the scheme would be rolled out in other big cities of the state too. The state government's goal is to provide affordable housing facilities to the entire slum population residing in urban areas of the state.

The rehabilitation scheme would be prepared by the Department of 'Housing for All'. Under this scheme, it would be ensured that the sites for the construction of flats are suitably located within the city and the slum dwellers are shifted to residential flats with their consent. There are a large number of slum dwellers in the state who are ready to shift in constructed dwelling units, he added.

HSR revised to check graft

Taking a historic decision to eradicate corruption, the Chief Minister has announced revision of the Haryana Schedule Rates (HSR) which remained unchanged since 1987. As per the announcement, new HSR will come into force from March 1, 2021. Besides, once the new HSR becomes effective, all the items will be included in the HSR, putting an end to inclusion of non-scheduled items. The revised HSR will act as base for inviting new tenders and evaluating work performance. The HSR will be revised after every five years, announced the Chief Minister.

He made this announcement while pressing over the first of its kind meeting with administrative secretaries and civil engineer contractors. The Chief Minister also announced that from now onwards, state-level IT solution will be introduced for works pertaining to civil engineering.

This IT system will be implemented from April 1, 2021. Under this system, contractors will have to get themselves registered. Apart from this, the registered contractors will not have to give bid security. However, at the time of registration they will now have to fill a bid security declaration form, announced Mr Manohar Lal.



HARYANA RANKS SIXTH IN INNOVATION INDEX

Its Innovation score of 25.81 is higher than the average score of 25.35 among major states

If it was the Sustainable Development Goals last year, it is the India Innovation Index this year. The tiny state of Haryana continues to score big on various parameters and rub shoulders with some of its advanced and progressive cousins in the country. In what amounts to a ringing endorsement of the innovative and futuristic policies pursued by the Manohar Lal Government, Haryana has creditably ranked sixth among the top ten innovative states in India.

According to the India Innovation Index 2020, prepared and released by the Niti Aayog, Karnataka has maintained its top position among the major states. While Maharashtra has leapfrogged Tamil Nadu to occupy the second place, Telangana, Kerala, Haryana, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh and Punjab complete the list of top ten in that order. Among the Union Territories and north-eastern and hill states, Delhi and Himachal occupy top spots, respectively.

It may be recalled that early last year Haryana had come to occupy the high bench shared by performers and front-runners from the standpoint of achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).Logging a composite score of 57, the state had performed very well chasing many of the 17 goals and meeting 169 targets. Ranking 18 among the 29 states in Niti Aayog's SDGs Report for 2019, the state was well on way to catching up with the national average of 60.

The 2020 edition of Innovation Index builds on the previous year's methodology by introducing more Business Environment; Safety and metrics to provide a more holistic Legal Environment. The two Per-

Haryana proudly shared space with other states under the category of performers for Goal 3 (Good health and wellbeing) and Goal 10 (Reduced inequalities).

Notably, Haryana had improved performance in the area of education with the state registering a decline in the number of students dropping out from secondary schools.

outlook of the Indian economy. The framework has been updated to include globally considered parameters for measuring innovation, such as the percentage of GDP spent on research and development, while keeping them specific to the Indian economy.

METHODOLOGY ADOPTED

The consensus that emerged after detailed rounds with experts Niti Aayog engaged with was to include input and output as the main dimensions for the index. Five inputs and two output pillars were created consisting of indicators that enable and epitomize innovation in India. The Index measures innovation inputs through 'Enablers' and innovation output as 'Performance.'

The five Enabler pillars that capture elements of the state economy and act as inputs for the innovation environment are: Human Capital; Investment; Knowledge workers;

formance pillars which depict the performance are: Knowledge output and knowledge diffusion.

INDEX SCORES

The two dimensions (Enablers and Performance) are believed to reflect equally important aspects of innovation. Therefore, while calculating the index no priority has been given to any dimension. Equal weight has been assigned to each of them to highlight their roles.

Creditably, Haryana's Innovation score of 25.81 is higher than the average innovation score of 25.35 among the major states. Take in totality Indian states have achieved an average score of 23.4 in the Innovation Index. Karnataka tops with 42.5 its high FDI inflow having also enhanced the innovation capabilities. Maharashtra follows second at 38, while Bihar finishes last at 14.5.

Out of a score of 80, Haryana logged 64.69 in Safety and Legal Environment and 47.22 in Human

Capital. The other scores are: Innovation 25.81; Enablers 32.59; Investment 16.49; Knowledge Workers 15.57; Business Environment 18.96; Performance 19.03; Knowledge Output 22.85; and Knowledge Diffusion 15.22.

The India Innovation Index, an outcome of extensive research and analysis for evaluating states' as well as the country's innovation readiness at a sub-national level, highlights the obstacles that deter governments, businesses, and individuals from fully capturing the benefits of innovation.

FOUR SECTIONS

The Niti Aayog report broadly consists of four thematic sections. The first talks about innovation and its ability to drive economic growth; the crucial role it plays in not only facilitating the country's recovery but also sustaining competitiveness during these times. Apart from this, a comparison is drawn between India and select economies on various parameters to give an idea how the country fares globally.

The next section lays out the unique framework of innovation and the methodology used to calculate the index, followed by key findings and rankings. Karnataka has maintained its top position among the major states, while Maharashtra has leapfrogged Tamil Nadu to occupy the second place, says the report.

This section also captures trends and provides a detailed analysis of various factors that drive innovation in the state and the country. The Niti Aayog hopes that these analyses will help policymakers in identifying the catalysts and inhibitors of innovation at the national and sub-national levels.

Key objectives

The objective of the India Innovation Index is to scrutinize the innovation capacities and performance of Indian states and Union Territories. It intends to accomplish the following three functions:


- Rank all states and union territories based on their index score
- Identify opportunities and challenges
- Assist in modifying governmental policies to foster innovation

The third section provides learning and recommendations at the national and state level for policymakers to ponder. Also included are profiles of all the states and union territories, providing a comprehensive snapshot of each region's current innovation landscape.

Finally, the last section of the report consists of detailed data tables for all the framework indicators, along with sources and definitions.

The last edition of the India Innovation Index, released in October 2019, was a first-of-its-kind metric for assessing the innovation capabilities of Indian states and union territories. Since then, India, and the world have undergone a tectonic shift due to the COVID-19 pandemic. With the pandemic triggering an economic shutdown, the role of innovation in revitalizing the economy has never been more important, says Niti Aayog.

eviving the river Sarasvati and making it flow along the Palaeo-course from Adi Badri (Yamunanagar) onwards as identified by the geo-scientists in Haryana is soon expected to become a reality.

Taking a major step forward, the state would build a dam on Som river located on the border of Haryana and Himachal Pradesh for the restoration of Sarasvati river. According to the Haryana Tourism Minister, Mr. Kanwar Pal, the Himachal Pradesh Government has given a No Objection Certificate (NOC) for the construction of this dam and the Irrigation Department has forwarded the design of the dam to Central Water Commission for further course of action.

The minister said at the place of Adi Badri, a barrage (dam) has also been proposed downstream of the Som river which will allow water to flow through the underground pipeline to the Sarasvati reservoir at village Rampur Hirya, Rampur Kambian, and Chillaur.

The administrative approval was accorded recently to construct a Dam, Barrage and Reservoir on Somb River for perennial flow of water in Sarasvati river throughout the year. The Haryana Sarasvati Heritage Development Board (HSHDB), which has been supervising the entire work, has also undertaken a series of research and development activities for the resurgence of the Vedic Sarasvati culture and heritage in the state.

For the Somb barrage and Sarasvati reservoir,the hydrological aspects and quantum of water in Sarasvati River has been finalised in consultation with the National Institute of Hydrology, Roorkee.

The construction of River section in district Yamuna Nagar from Sarasvati Reservoir to Uncha-Chandna and construction of intervening structures i.e. bridges, culverts, cross-drainage works, hydraulic fall inlets etc. from Sarasvati Reservoir to its outfall in River Ghaggar-Sarasvati has been envisaged in the next step.

It was on November 17, 1985 that Padma Shri Dr. V.S. Wakankar started a three-day Sarasvati Shodh Yatra from Adi Badri, Yamuna Nagar under the inspiration of Manopanth Pingle.

Haryana Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal, who is Chairman of the Haryana Sarasvati Heritage Development Board (HSHDB), actively participated in it.

It was as a result of the inspiration and experience gained through the Yatra that the Sarasvati Heritage Development Board under his Chairmanship was established in October 2015 with a purpose of reviving the culture and heritage of River Sarasvati and presenting it to the world.

The Sarasvati Heritage places like Adi Badri, Sarasvati Nagar, Kurukshetra, Pehowa, Kalayat, Kunal, Bhirdana, Rakhi-Garhi, Sirsaetc have been considered for Tourist Circuit under the Swadesh Darshan Scheme of the Government of India.



The Haryana Police seized a whopping 22.5 tonnes of narcotic substances across the state in 2020.

According to Director General of Police (DGP), Mr Manoj Yadava, police filed a total of 3,024 cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in 2020, as against 2,645 cases registered in 2019. The quantity of drugs seized also increased by 41.53 per cent in 2020 as compared to the previous year. A total of 22,569 kg of opium, charas, sulpha, poppy husk, smack, ganja and heroin were confiscated between January and December 2020.

Giving details, he said that 225 kg opium, 250 kg charas/sulpha, over 12828 kg poppy husk, 8 kg 253 gram smack, over 9223 kg ganja and 33 kg 198 gram heroin was seized. To prevent drug trafficking, police have been working relent- sharing information about sale,

Under the welfare initiatives of the state government, Haryana Police gave government jobs to 45 dependents of deceased police personnel under the new ex-gratia policy during 2020. DGP Mr Manoj Yadava said the Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal, had announced on Police Shahidi Diwas that one family member each of 50 police personnel would be provided government job under the new ex-gratia scheme of the state government.

"We have already given jobs to 45 next-of-kin of our brave officers and Jawans. Out of these, 31 dependents had been appointed constables, 12 clerks and two in class IV jobs. The process to cover the remaining eligible dependents under the new policy is on," he added. It is noteworthy that the state government has implemented a new ex-gratia scheme under which one family member would be provided with a government job in case of the death of an employee before the age of 52 years.

The DGP said that enforcement of Covid lockdown and maintenance of public order was a big challenge for the police in 2020. In order to restrict the spread of the deadly virus, police have taken a series of steps to enforce the lockdown with a humane face since the lockdown was enforced.

"Till now, over 2900 policemen have been infected by coronavirus. Out of these, 2,813 cases have been recovered. However, our 14 police personnel working in the frontlines have succumbed to Covid-19. A proposal regarding the financial assistance of Rs 30 lakh each to the dependents of deceased policemen have been already sent to the government," he added.

There is a considerable increase in maritime trafficking of heroin. On January 6, 2020, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) seized 35 kg of heroin from a boat off Gujarat (western) coast. On May 20, 2019, 218 kg of heroin was seized from a boat off the Gujarat (western) coast. Again in March 2019, the NCB seized 100 kg of heroin from a boat in Gujarat and in 2017, the seizure of 1445 kg of heroin from MV Henry was again done in Gujarat.

In November 2019, seizure of 224 kg of heroin by Sri Lanka was done on the basis of Indian intelligence inputs. Similarly, in October 2019, seizure of 150 kg of heroin from a boat in Maldives was carried out after India intelligence shared the inputs. In July and August in 2019, seizure of 155 kg heroin from a boat in Sri Lanka, was carried out on the basis of information passed on by India, he pointed out.

Another concern from the drug law enforcement agencies is the trafficking of heroin from Myanmar to India. In March 2019, seizure of 44.5 kg heroin (Rs 180 crore) in Delhi was sourced from Myanmar. In April 2019, again seizure of 50 kg heroin (Rs 200 crore) in Delhi was sourced from Myanmar.




lections of Mrs Khandelwal on this day assumed special significance as from this year, it has been decided



espite the devastating impact of the coronavirus pandemic, the state of Haryana has recorded a remarkable increase of 16 per cent in the enrolment in government polytechnics and eight per cent increase in the government aided polytechnics for the current session as compared to the last year. An official spokesperson told Haryana Review that the government technical institutions in the state including 37 government polytechnics and four government aided polytechnics have managed to make around 90 per cent admissions for the session 2020-21.

The Department of Technical Education while maintaining this tempo has decided to reward 17 principals of the government technical institutions and 14 officers or officials of the Haryana State Technical Education Society (HSTES) with letters of been achieved, he added.

appreciation, he added. He further informed that in the academic session 2017-18, a total of 9,017 students took admission in the government polytechnics. In 2018-19, total enrolment went up to 10,607. For the 2019-20 session, 9,165 students were enrolled. In 2020-21, a total of 12007 students took the admission.

Moreover, the department took an extraordinary initiative for the differently abled students (speech and hearing impaired) to study various polytechnic courses at the Government Polytechnic, Sector 26, Panchkula. For the benefit of these students, no admission and tuition fee has been charged and facility of interpreter in Indian sign language has also been provided for better understanding of the curriculum. Also, the diploma course in computer engineering and architectural assistantship has been started with 15 seats in each branch and 100 per cent admissions have

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
