The fortinide and determination of Haryana to fight Covid-19 have been unflagging even as the state, while extending the lock-down till May 17, has launched the "Mahamari Alert, Sunakshit Haryana" campaign with stringent measures to contain the pandemic.

Continuing the earlier restrictions on commercial establishments and movement of people, the state government has now banned the gathering of more than 11 persons, be it a wedding or funeral.

In order to intensify the war against pandemic the state government has undertaken a novel "Test, Track and Treat" campaign to curb the swiftly spreading wave of COVID-19 in villages. Under the campaign, "Test, Track and Treat", the government has decided to launch a special door-to-door screening drive in villages by constituting 8000 multidisciplinary teams. Health screening camps to cover each household would be organised on a war footing to iden

tify the silent carriers of the virus and put them to treatment much before they spread it unwittingly. All efforts are being made not to let the oxygen problem crop up in the state. Soon five oxygen plants will start operating in Kanial, Panchekula, Hisar, Sirsa and Faridabad as equipment and machinery required for setting up these plants have been received by the government. Officials said as many as 60 oxygen plants would be set up in due course. While corona vaccination of people aged between 18 and 45 years has already been underway in all districts, the state government has announced that an amount of Rs 5,000 will be given as medical aid to Covid patients below the poverty line on home isolation.

The vaccination drive has been going on vigorously as about 45 lakh people has been vaccinated at about 200 centres across the state. In order to curb the malpractices of private health institutions, the state government has directed that a rate list of charges by ambulances should be displayed in every hospital so that people do not face any

problem while paying for them. Along with it, a rate list of oxygen beds, ventilator beds, normal beds in every hospital should also, be displayed on the notice boards in all the hospitals so that patients visiting any hospital do not face any trouble.



#### LAND BANK TO KILL TWO BIRDS WITH ONE ST

ut to kill two birds with one stone—saving the farmers from the scourge of distress from the scoinge of distress sale of land and facilitating the land-strapped government to offer land to departments for setting projects of public interest—the Haryana Government plans to set up a land bank under an integrated policy.

Titled "Policy for Purchase of Land Voluntarily Offered to Government For Development Projects, Creating Land Bank for Government Department includ-

Government Department, includ-ing Boards and Corporations and Disposal Thereof," it would aim to create a land bank for government

departments as well as for boards and corporations.

The proposed bank will com-prise and consolidate such chunks of surplus land as had been once acquired by various departments under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 (Central Act 1 of 1894) but do not need them now It would



also clear the hurdles dogging the path of the state government in making land available to the de-partments that need them most for

setting up public utilities.
Giving out details, Mr Sanjeev
Kaushal, FCR and ACS, Revenue
and Disaster Management Department, told Haryana Review, "The
proposed bank will offer a win-win
citation both for the curring land situation both for the surplus land holders, including departments and farmers, and the state government. While the former will be able to sell land at a competitive price, the

latter would not have to look the other way when any department knocks at its door for land for set-ting up any public utility."

Land will be offered to de-partments for setting up essential

services, including water works, power sub-stations, colleges and other specialized institutions of higher learning, including univer-sities, medical colleges, hospitals and polytechnics etc.

The unutilized land of various government departments, boards and corporations is proposed to

be clubbed together at one place under the Revenue and Disaster Management Department which will serve as nodal department. All departments, including boards and corporations, shall explore such lands and put these chunks in the proposed bank to ensure optimum utilization, Mr Kaushal said.

In the event of the bank having surplus land after meeting the pres-ent and future requirements of de-partments, boards and corporations, especially such land as has been purchased from a landowner by the government to minimize distress sale, the state government shall be able to dispose it off in a transparent

manner by e-auction, he added. Wanting to sell land to the government, farmers can apply on the online portal to be created by the Director. Land Records, to make an offer by giving complete details of land, including negotiable price of the same. He must enclose relevant land records and quote their expected rate while submitting an online application.

#### CM announces 1-month extension of service

The Haryana Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal, has said that given the current COVID 19 situation in the state, a one month extension of service has been given to the employees of BDPO, Tehsildar and Health Department, who were to retire on April 30, 2021.

#### **Gram Sachiv to** register deeds

The Haryana Government has decided that Gram Sachiv of the panchayat concerned will carry out execution and registration of title certificates in Lal Dora (Abadi Deh) under the Svamitva Scheme, till the formation of new gram

panchayats in the state. Stating this, Financial Commissioner, Revenue, and Additional Chief Secretary, Revenue and Disaster Management, Mr Sanjeev Kaushal, said that instruc-tions to this effect had been issued to all deputy commissioners in the state.

Directions have been issued that title certificates pertaining to public utility lands, that is, panchayat ghar school, dispensary, water works, Johar, patwar khana anganwadi and public streets, duly registered, are issued in favour of 'Panchayat Deh'.

## COMING, AADHAAR-TYPE NUMBER FOR EVERY PLOT

Pilot project launched in Manesar and Sirsi village of Karnal set to be extended to entire state

Sooner than later, every plot in Haryana shall be known by an Aadhaar-base Victoria by an Aadhaar-type Unique Parcel Identification Number (ULPIN). Besides facilitating iden-tification of the plot in a unique and unambiguous manner, the GIS-based Unified Land Information System (ULIS) will not only help create an online land information system, but will also enable other stakeholders to

with also chaole other state holders to use it to generate more value.

A pilot project to mark every plot with a number has already been kicked off in Manesar tehsil of Gurgram and Sirsi village of Karnal to take forward the Digital India Land Record Modernization Programme. After successful implementation of the pilot project, the Haryana Gov-ernment plans to approach the NIC team and other agencies to roll out the system all over the state. Giving broad outlines of the pro-

gramme and the benefits flowing from it, Mr Sanjeev Kaushal, Haryana Financial Commissioner, Revenue, told Haryana Review that the unique number would make avail-able comprehensive information on land and properties, consisting of textual and spatial data besides maintaining consistency of the core
data across all departments and
agencies of the government.
The project would spell many ad-

vantages. Single source of truth on land will stand out as an authoritative reference to authenticate ownership and other parameters of the record. Unique categorization of government lands would benefit instant identification and prevention of transfer of such lands to individuals during transac-

in the registration.

It will also help cross-validate land records related data across various departments. Besides, standardisation at data and application level would bring about effective integration and interoperability across departments and other stakeholders/ service providers, he added.

#### VISION & MISSION

The Unique Land Parcel Identification Number (ULPIN) shall be a single, authoritative source of truth of information on any parcel of land or property to provide integrated land services to the citizens as well as all stake holders. It will identify such departments as provide land related services; identify services of these land departments; assign a unique ID to each parcel; and set up a federated land information system which works in collaborative manner.

#### What is property identifier unit

For implementation of ULPIN, administrative and financial support shall be extended by DoLR accord-


ing to the guidelines of DILRMP and technical support for rolling out the system will be facilitated by NIC, Survey of India, Department of Science and Technology and National Remote sensing centre.
This Unique ID of parcel, being

very precise and accurate, should not be shared in the public domain due to their strategic and accurate locational and security values. It may be mapped with another unique random number with prefix state code, which can be shared with the owner and in public domain for all practical pur-poses, Mr Kaushal added.

However, sharing of the unique ID with the land owners or keeping it in public domain before mapping it to another unique random number with prefix state code is in the purview of the respective state revenue department as ownership of the land records data is vested in the respective revenue departments of the states/UTs.

#### **FINER GOALS & OBJECTIVES**

- The ULIS would seek to identify departments dealing with land regulation and rendering land related services to the citizens (exlated services to the chizens (ex. revenue, municipal, panchayat, forest, registration, survey etc). It would identify the services of such departments, including
- those which are multi-depart-mental in nature. (Ex: mutation of land, land use conversion from agricultural to non-agri-
- cultural, etc) Work out a strategy and develop a system to assign Unique ID to each land parcel by respective states/UTs
- Create an online land information system with open standards APIs (Application Programming In-terface) that is based on GIS and is OGC-compliant so that other stakeholders could use them on-
- line to generate further value. Provide comprehensive information on land and properties, con-sisting of textual and spatial data
- Maintain consistency of the core data across all departments and agencies of the government.

Alive to the hardships being faced by different vulnerable social groups and other poor, the state government has made a number of affirmative interventions to mitigate their woes and improve the ease of their lives.

and improve the ease of their lives.
From old age pension to financial support to poorer social sections, the intent gets explicitly reflected in the government's humane approach towards those whose holistic empowerment is the need of the hour to build a resilient, inclusive social order in the State.

A case in point is the recent announcement of a bonanza of welfare schemes for sanitation workers. Now the monthly salary of sanitation workers working in rural areas has been increased from Rs 12,000 to Rs 14,000 per month and monthly salary of sanitation workers working in urban areas has been increased from Rs 15,000 to Rs 16,000 per month, a major financial boost to those on the margins.

Similarly, sewerage men, who put a lot at stake while carrying out their responsibilities, will now get Rs 12,000 per month instead of monthly salary of Rs 10,000. Haryana is perhaps the only state in the country, which has created a mechanism to ensure their salaries are not delayed. In case of any delay, the salary of sanitary workers will be paid from the amount of Rs 1 crore that has been provided to the Deputy Commissioner.

Deputy Commissioner.
Even if there is a delay in the payment of salaries due to some reasons, they will get an additional compensation of Rs 500 along with the salarty of next month. Besides, there will be no diversion of budget allocated by the Finance Department for the salaries of sanitary workers. Similarly, high risk conditions are involved in sewage cleaning works. For the protection of sanitary workers, a new technology has been introduced in Rewari and Grurugram.

Under the new arrangements, all

Under the new arrangements, all sewage manholes will be connected to sensors. In case of overflow in the sewage manhole, there will be an alert in the concerned office and cleaning will be done by machines. At the same time, an insurance compensation of Rs 10 lakh is being provided to the family of the workers engaged in sewage cleaning.

ers engaged in sewage cleaning.

Upon the death of the workers engaged in works other than sewage cleaning, a benefit of Rs 5 lakh will be provided to the family under the Pradhan Mantri Jeevan

Suraksha Bima Yojana while Rs 2 lakh will be provided after natural death of the worker. As per rules, the benefit of

As per rules, the benefit of ex-gratia is provided to regular employees. In future, it will be provided to all on-roll sanitary workers. Sanitary workers having annual income of up to Rs 1.80 lakh will be able to take a collateral-free loan for education of their children and if a person is not able to pay such loan, then it will be compensated by the State government. Training will be provided for the job of sewer man and only those who have obtained a certificate for the same will be allowed for sewage cleaning works.

The Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Welfare Minister, Dr Banwari Lal, said the Chief Minister takes special care of the vulnerable sections of society. All types of facilities are being made available online by the government. The Haryana State Commission for Safai Karamchari has been constituted for raising the living standard of sanitation workers.

The Chief Minister has also in-

The Chief Minister has also increased the legal aid amount being given to the people belonging to Scheduled Castes from Rs 11,000 to Rs 21,000. Financial assistance given under Dr B R Ambedkar Awas Navinikam Yojana has been increased from Rs 51,000 to Rs 80,000. he added.





# ROADS PAVE THE WA

Rural road connectivity and its sustained availability is a key component of rural development as it assures continuural road connectivity and ing access to economic and social services and, thereby, generates sustained increase in agricultural incomes and productive employment opportunities.

It is also, as a result, a vital ingredient in ensuring sustainable poverty reduction which demands permanent rural connectivity, encompassing a high level of quality of construction followed by continuous post-construction maintains. tinuous post-construction mainte-nance of the road asset and in fact

of the entire network.

Haryana, which rightly boasts of having one of the best road infrastructures in the country, is making efforts to further strengthen the road network across the state and ease increasing traffic congestion

ease increasing traine congestion for the convenience of commuters. The state government is spend-ing Rs 383.58 crore on the up-gra-dation of 83 roads with a cumulative length of 688.94 km under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana - III (PMGSY-III). Out of 688 km, 200 kms of road length has been completed, and the remaining length will be completed by the end of the financial year 2021-22.

#### Work on Haryana Orbital Rail Corridor set to begin

The Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal's strong initiatives aimed at building a robust connectivity across the state have led to sustained improvement and strengthening of the road and rail system. In what comes as a soothing development, the Haryana Rail Infrastructure Development Corporation (HRIDC), a joint venture of Haryana government and the Railways Ministry, has entered into an agreement with the RITES for the construction of the corridor for providing railway infrastructure technology and economic services.

On behalf of HRIDC, the agreement was signed by Mr Narinder D Chumber, Director, Projects & Planning, AND Piyush Kansal, Executive Director, RITES. HRIDC has been constituted with an aim to provide eco-friendly and seamless connectivity as a cost-effective and sustainable mode of transport which will enable polycentric growth in Haryana.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) on September 15 last year had approved 121.742 km long dual electrified broad gauge line of Haryana Orbital Rail Corridor from Palwal to Sonipat with an estimated cost of Rs 5,617.69 crore.

Once the corridor is completed, the economic development in the state will get a new boost. It will attract multinational companies to set up their manufacturing units, which will further add verve to the 'Make in India' mission.

Over 76 lakh employment opportunities will also be created through this project. This corridor from Palwal to Sonipat will be dual electrified broad gauge from Sohna, Manesar, and Kharkhoda and will provide seamless connectivity to Prithla Dedicated Freight Corridor from Palwal, Patli, Sultanpur, Asaudha, and Harsana Kalan stations of Indian Railways. The project is being funded by Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) and shall be completed in five years.

Narendra Singh Tomar, on December 17, 2019. For Haryana, an indicative allocation of the length of 2,500 km has been made by the Ministry for a

five-year period up to 2019-2024. According to an official spokesperson, while acknowledging Haryana's swiftness towards completing their target set un-der the PMGSY, the Ministry of Rural Development on March 5, 2021 sanctioned 120 roads with a length of 1216.95 km amounting to Rs 549.51 crore - Centre's share Rs.328.43 crore and state share Rs.221.08 crore – under Batch-II. Tenders for all the works in Batch II have been floated.

For the remaining 600 km, scruti-ny of proposals is under process and it is expected that approval for these proposals from the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India, will be received by June 30, 2021.

A three-tier quality manage-ment system is being followed as per guidelines of PMGSY Besides, from time to time inspections of

roads are being conducted by the Executive Engineer, Sub Divisional Engineers and Junior Engineers un-der Tire-I. In Tire-II. State Quality

Monitors are appointed by the State.

For all the works in the past and present, regular inspection of roads is being conducted. If the condition of the road is found not satisfactory, or, if any improvement is required, the state government seeks the Action Taken Report from the concerned PIU/Division. As on date there is no pending Action Taken Report.
