Rs 500-cr fund to help ramp up production

A revolving fund of Rs 500 crore is being set

Excise boom busts Covid

Livery government crafts new policies. But policies that produce results leave a mark on the governance landscape. A case in point is Haryana's excise policy the success of which is being reflected in the revenue of the state.

In the first quarter of 2021-22 (April to June, 2021) revenue collection from excise aggregated Rs 1751.04 crore against Rs 1370.86 during the corre-

against is 157.05 using the contestion sponding period last year, registering an increase of about 28 per cent.
During June, 2021 the excise wing of the department collected revenue of Rs 1,004.70 crore whereas against Rs 586.32 crore during the corresponding period last year. Thus, excise revenue has increased by 71.36 per cent in the month of June over the previous year

The Excise Policy for 2020-21 has been so designed as to ensure transparency in the allotment of liquor vends through renewal or e-tendering. Li-cences in 1,004 zones of retail liquor vends have been renewed in 2021-22. The department has achieved revenue of Rs 3,201.46 crore from the renewal of these zones against the license fee of Rs 2,910 crore in the previous year.

For the allotment of the remaining 159 zones, e-tendering has already started. Till now, 12 rounds through e-ten-dering have been successfully complet-ed. Total 1,123 zones have been allotted so far, from which a license fee of Rs 3601 crore shall be collected in the year 2021-22 for these zones. Only 40 zones are now pending in the state, for which bids were invited on July, 5, 2021 It is worth mentioning that L-1BF

licenses for wholesale trade of Import-ed Foreign Liquor (IFL) for 2021-22 have been granted by way of inviting online applications. A total of 14 ap-plicants have been shortlisted as eligi-ble applicants for grant of L-1BF after receiving their applications through the online departmental portal.

Cracking the whip on defaulters, a total of 1,152 cases of violation of rules were registered in 2020-21 and a fine of Rs 186.96 crore was imposed, out of which Rs 60.08 crore has been recovered. Penalty of Rs 63,15,17,600 has been imposed under Section 72-E of the Punjab Excise Haryana Amendment Act, 2020; recovery of Rs 6,56,59,853 has been made.

During 2021-22, the government

gave a rebate of about 8 per cent in the fees for bar-licence. This year bar license holders will have to pay only 11 months' fee. CCTV cameras are being installed in distilleries, breweries and bottling plants to check the sale of liquor without paying tax and prevent the loss of revenue. And to monitor all this, a control room is also being set up in the head office at Panchkula

Tap water connections up 33 pc in 24 months

Totwithstanding the multitude of hiccups caused by two waves of Covid-19, Haryana has done exceedingly well under the Central Government's ambitious programme

– Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM).

This is no mean achievement, but a cause for celebration for the state and its people. Reasons are not too far to seek. Pure water means a big boost to people's overall health. Con-taminated water and poor sanitation are linked to transmission of diseases such as cholera, diarrhea, dysentery, Hepatitis A, typhoid, and polio.

Absent, inadequate, or inappro-priately managed water and sanitation services expose individuals to preventable health risks. Inadequate management of urban, industrial, and agricultural wastewater means the drinking water of hundreds of millions of people is dangerously contaminated or chemically polluted.

The Prime Minister, Mr Narendra Modi, on August 15, 2019 announced Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) to provide safe piped drinking water to every rural household in the country by 2024. To transform the Prime Minister's vision that every household will have assured tap water supply by 2024, in the last 21 months, despite Covid-19 pandemic, repeated disruptions and lockdowns, 4.25 crore rural households have been provided tap water connections.

The ministry further said in the statement that Haryana planned to provide tap water connections to 2.61 lakh households in 2021-22 and to remaining 1.48 lakh house-holds in 2022-23.

Singh Shekhawat, has approved Central allocation of Rs 8,216.25 crore for 2021-22. This is more than four times the allocation to these states/UTs in 2020-21. The Central Government has also assured full assistance to these states and UTs for making provision of tap water supply in every rural home

SEEKS RS 3,250 CR FROM CENTRE

To provide drinking water at the rate of 130 litres instead of 55 litres and sewerage facility in 130 villages coming under Mahagram scheme, Haryana has requested the Central Government to allocate an amount of Rs 3250 crore so that an amount of Rs 25 crore can be spent for each Mahagram in the State. Under the 'Nal Se Jal' scheme, eight districts of Haryana have been completely covered and soon Haryana will be the first state in the country to cover all the districts under this scheme.

Under 'Atal Bhujal Yojana', piezometers would be installed in 1669 villages of Haryana to record the level of groundwater and plans for better utilization of water would be prepared. Haryana has also proposed the Centre to set up a model water body in an area of 15 acres for grey water management in one of the villages -- Baland village of Rohtak district or Dubheta village of

Sonepat district. Under the 'Mera Pani Meri Virasat' scheme, this year a target of cultivating crops other than paddy in a total area of two lakh acres has been set. Last year, alternate crops having less water requirement were cultivated in an area of 94,000 acres last year and an incentive amount of Rs 7,000 per acre is given to farmers. The scheme intends to check the state's depleting water level.

11 districts hit the goal

- Bhiwani, Sonepat, Panipat, Panchkula, Ambala, Kurukshetra, Karnal, Rohtak, Kaithal, Faridabad

Need to educate farmers on 3 bills: CM

n the wake of the ongoing pro-test by a group of farmers Hary-ana Chief Minister Manohar Lal undertook a new initiative and mooted the "educate farmers" mission in the state to dispel misgiv-ings on the three Agriculture bills

An idea that can go a long way in transforming the narrative in ag-riculture is expected to take off in

the state soon.

During interaction with representatives of farmers' organisations recently, the chief minister suggested that a group of 30-40 farmers, having factual knowledge about the spread awareness in the entire farming community at the village level.

"Rather than agitating against the farm laws, every farmer should be well-versed with the benefits of these laws so that the designs of people, who have been spreading misleading information about the bills, are defeated", the chief minister said.

He also suggested that if needed, training camps for farmers be organised to help them get ample knowledge about the farm laws and spread awareness about them.

FOCUS ON QUALITATIVE & QUANTITATIVE FARMING

The chief minister called upon

farmers to focus on domg qualitative and quantitative farming.

"Adopting qualitative and quantitative farming is the need of the hour and in view of the present circumstances, farmers would have to move ahead in the agriculture sector only by accepting the challenges. Also, if farmers wish to increase their income, then they have to move towards natural farmine." to move towards natural farming said the chief minister adding that the three laws would certainly prove to be a major reform in the agriculture sector and would not only liberate the farmers in the real sense to sell their produce any-where in the country but would also keep the MSP and the Mandi system intact

The chief minister underlined his government's commitment to safe-guarding the interest of farmers guarding the interest of farmers and the farming community. While recounting various steps the state government had taken to help farm-ers the chief minister underscored the importance of the 'Mera Pani Meri Virasat Yojana' which is make optimum use of underground water. The Chief Minister said that focused schemes should be made to increase the income of farm-ers. He asked the officers of the

ers. He asked the officers of the Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Department to make small groups of progressive farmers and train run continuously. This will bring a paradigm shift in the agriculture sector, he added. He said that the focus has to be

on how to develop other sources of increasing the income of farm-ers having small lands. Describing vertical farming as useful in this direction, he asked the officers to work more to spread awareness about the same.

Keeping this in mind, the 'Meri Fasal Mera Byora' scheme has been implemented to update the data of crops sown on every acre. Similarly, 'Mera Pani Meri Virasat' is being implemented with a focus on proper management of water, said the chief minister.



FPOs boost to potato gr

n a major boost to the state government's ongoing efforts to enhance farmer's income and intensify crop diversification, Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) have proved a blessing for tomato growers. They are getting their pro-duce timely supplied, bringing good prices and minimizing crop waste as well. Since May and June are crucial for tomato crop harvesting, FPOs have started supplying the produce

to food processing companies.

According to an official spokes-person, three FPOs of Yamumanagar district -- Radour Farms Produc-er Company Ltd, Sadhaura Kisan Producer Company Ltd, and Sili Kalan Farms Producers Ltd have been supplied with more than 450 tonnes of tomatoes. This would not have been possible for the farmer at their own level. FPOs have made their task much easier.

The state government aims to set up more than 1000 FPOs. Some of ese FPOs associated with tomato



cultivation have played an important role in the journey of prosperi-ty of farmers in the last two years. Giving detailed information, the spokesperson of the Horticulture Department said the months of May and June in Haryana are very crucial in terms of sale of tomato crop, because during these months the tomato crop is ready for harvest and there is every possibility of falling crop prices in the market thanks to bumper harvest.

Since the situation has got chalsince the situation has got chai-lenging in view of the Covid-19 pan-demic, Haryana government, helped foster coordination between food processing companies and FPOs of the state with the help of Horticul-ture Department and Small Farmers. ture Department and Small Farmers' Agri-Business Consortium, Haryana, and arranged for the supply of 1000 tonnes of tomatoes. When tomato prices in the market are less than the prescribed price, in that case the state government compensates farmers for this difference of price under the Bhavantar Bharpai Yojana.

Agriculture sector plays a very important role in both economic de-

velopment and nation building. India is globally in the forefront of devel-opment of agriculture. The goal is to Achieve doubling of exports by 2022. However, more than 86 per cent of farmers in the country are small and marginal. There is a need to facilitate our farmers with access to improved technology, credit, better input and more markets to incentivize them to produce better quality commodities.

- Aggregation of small, marginal and landless farmers into FPOs will help enhance economic strength and market linkages of farmers for enhancing their income. The Centre aims to form 10,000 FPOs with a clear strategy and committed resources. Financial assistance up to Rs 18 lakh per FPO for a period of three years will be provided.



According to the latest Economic Survey Report, 15 new government colleges, namely GC Isharwal (Bhiwani), GC Mangali (Hisar), GC Agroha (Hisar), GC Chhatter (Jind), GC Ladana Chaku (Kaithal), GC Rajound (Kaithal), GC Firozpur Jhirka (Nuh), GC Bhaindoli (Palwal), SMMD GC (Panchkula), GC Morni (Panchkula), GC Ding Mandi (Sirsa), GC Goriwala (Sirsa), GC Bhainswal Kalan (Sonepat), and GC Baroda (Sonepat), GC Pratap Nagar (Yamunanagar) have been started. While one seeks to confer ownership rights on the villagers over land, the other seeks to give ownership rights to those having houses and shops of municipal bodies on lease or rental basis for the past 20 years. Interestingly, these speak for equity: while the former will bring ownership to some ruralites, the latter will benefit those in the urban areas.

Haryana Review has a close look at the two milestone measures to bring out their impact and import and make the readers wise on how these will benefit the people.

In a first, Haryana to give property rights to villagers

st state in the country to launch SVAM-ITVA Scheme, Haryana may well be the

first to complete its implementation.

The scheme under which land in the villages is being measured scientifically with the help of drones to make an accurate assessment, seeks to confer ownership rights on the villagers. Ownership certificates will not only unlock value of the land but also

open up vistas of new opportunities.

Disclosing this, Mr Sanjeev Kaushal,
Haryana Additional Chief Secretary and Financial Commissioner, Revenue & Disaster Management and Consolidation Depart-ment, said a target had been set to ensure implementation of the SVAMITVA Scheme in the entire state in the next 90 days. With completion of the work, villages will be Lal Dora-free. Officers have been directed to complete the work of implementation of the scheme with full dedication.

"Haryana is the first state in the country to start implementation of this scheme. The Central Government, after considering its effectiveness, has implemented it all over the country. Now that the second wave of Covid-19 is receding and the daily positivity rate of Haryana has come down to 0.19 per cent, the officers should expedite the work and complete the scheme. I am hopeful that Haryana will be the first state to complete the scheme", Mr Kaushal said. Soon, 10 drones would be procured by the

Harvana Government so that the SVAMIT-VA Scheme could be completed within the stipulated time-frame. Mr Kaushal has directed the Deputy Commissioners to develop modern revenue records in each district. Evweek a review will be done at the regional level regarding completion of this project.

Meanwhile, officers of the Survey of India

have been directed to prepare a strip map of the area bordering Haryana with UP and Delhi

so that disputes can be settled at the earliest.

With a view to lending legal sanctity
and statutory backing to the SVAMITVA
Scheme in 'Abadi Deh' (Lal Dora) of various revenue estates in the state, the Haryana Revenue and Disaster Management Department has constituted a committee for drafting necessary amendments and insertions in three different Acts. The initiative for providing statutory backing to the scheme was taken by the Deputy Chief Minister, Sh. Dushyant Singh Chautala during a review meeting held with Deputy Commissioners

The committee which would be headed by Mr Ramesh Chander Bidhan, Director General, Development and Panchayats, the multi departments involving the Rev-enue, Development and Panchayats and Urban Local Bodies Department will propose draft amendments and insertions in the Punjab Common Lands (Regulations) Act 1961, the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973, and the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 for providing legal framework to the scheme. It will submit its report within a fortnight. An order to this effect has been issued by Mr Sanjeev Kaushal.

ajor relief is on the way to those in Haryana owning houses and shops of municipal bodies on lease or rental basis for the past 20 years. After announcing ownership rights for all such owners, the Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal, launched Mukhyamantri Shehri Nikay SVAMITVA Yojana Portal www.ulb.shops. ulbharyana gov.in invitine annilications. applications ulbharyana gov in inviting from the eligible beneficiaries

Since the decision taken by the state Cabinet was announced, data of as many as 16,000 applicants has become available with the Urban Local Bodies Department. With the pro-

ban Local Bodies Department. With the pro-cess of inviting applications having begun on July 1, this number is likely to increase. A weekly plan for staggering the appli-cations has also been made under which the process of accepting applications would auto-matically be blocked after 1,000 applications. After taking the applications, objections

would be invited within a month and once all the objections are rectified, the applicants would be called for submitting the required documents to get benefit of the scheme.

The applicants would be able to see details of their applications on the individual dashboard designed for them. This would complete by eradicate the manual registration process," said the Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal. Under this scheme, if someone has con-structed more than the floor or area of the

allotted building of the municipality, he will have to deposit an additional amount that is Rs 1.000 as per the additional constructed area

If the applicant is not an allottee or sub-le tee as per rules of the municipality but fulfils all the eligibility criteria of the policy, they will also have to pay a lump sum regular fee of Rs 30,000 in addition to the amount and tax to be paid as mentioned in the Policy.

The Haryana Government had framed a policy under which the tenant will have to pay less than the present collector rate to get the ownership right. If anyone has taken a shop, house on the municipal land either on rent, lease basis, Tehbazari or by paying a license fee for 20 years or more then all such occupiers would be given ownership right. But the occupier should have com-pleted 20 years as of December 31, 2020.

A rebate of 20 per cent on the current collector rate would be given to such tenants as have been residing in the house or are running a shop for the past 20 years. Similarly, those who have an occupancy period of 50 years will get a rebate of up to 50 per cent. Besides, if an occupant period of the past years will get a rebate of up to 50 per cent. Besides, if an occupant period of the past years of the past years. occupier has a period of more than 50 years, he occupier has a period of more than 50 years, he will be given a maximum relaxation of 50 per cent only on the present collector rate.

The municipalities associated with the occupiers who are found eligible by the compe

tent authority will issue a notice to the benetent authorny will issue a notice to the bene-ficiary asking them to pay the amount fixed after the rebate within a period of 15 days. The beneficiary will have to deposit 25 per cent of the total fixed amount to the con-

cerned municipality within a period of 15 days counted from issuance of the notice, while the remaining 75 per cent amount will have to be deposited within three months. The Chief Minister said if the municipality has rented or leased any land building to

to be paid as per the fixed floor-wise formula.

If only one allottee has been allotted the constructed building, he will have to pay the

base rate. If the municipality has constructed two floors and each floor is given to two different allottees, 60 per cent of the base rate for the ground floor and 40 per cent of the base rate for the first floor will have to be paid.

vailability of power is a big boon for any state be it for do-mestic, industrial or agriculture purposes. Haryana has made sure that there was no crisis whatsoever as far as availability and supply of power around the state is concerned.

In this direction, the state gov-nment's "Mhara Gaon, Jagmag Gaon" scheme has been spreading new light around the state to cover all villages and cities for round-the-

clock supply of electricity.

So far, 5287 villages have been covered under it and recently 17 more

villages were added to the list, nine of them in Sonipat district, five in Rohtak district and one each village in Panipat, Kaithal and Jhajjar districts.

Broadly, 77 per cent of the total villages in Haryana and ten districts have been covered under the scheme that was launched by Chief Minister Manohar Lal in 2015 in Dayalpura village in Kurukshetra district.

With this, there is 24 hours power supply in 10 districts of the state, including Pachankula, Ambala, Kurukshet-ra, Yamunanagar, Karnal, Gurugram, Faridabad, Sirsa, Rewari and Fatehabad.

Under this Scheme, the old power cables are replaced by new aerial bunch cables in the villages, while old and

malfunctioning meters are replaced, thereafter the villagers are requested to pay the outstanding electricity bills. as soon as the line loss of the rural feeders reduces, then the village is in-cluded in Mhara Gaon, Jagmag Gaon Scheme and new power infrastructure in the village is built along with a 24hour uninterrupted power supply. Of-ficials admit that the scheme has been successful due to the positive attitude of villagers and their commitment to timely submission of electricity bills.

Besides this scheme, efforts have been constantly made to check incidents of power theft. More than 230 teams of officials have been at job carrying out raids to detect power

were registered during the last one year making the state government earn Rs 536 crores as revenue.

The line losses have been reduced from 30.3 per cent to 17.17 per cent with the installation of efficient supply infrastructure.

The government has been lately engaged in shifting of dangerous supply lines passing over residential areas, schools and ponds. Officials said that 2539 such lines would be shifted at a cost of Rs 96 crores.

The state government has set a target to release about 7621 tube well connections by July 15, 2021, to farmers. So far about 9401 tube well

According to officials, farmers who had applied for tube well con-nection before January 1, 2019, are being allotted power connections in a phased manner. A total number of 17022 tube well connections will be released in the first phase. Similarly, about 40,000 applicants will be covered under the second phase, following which a target has been set to provide tube well connections to them by June 30, 2022. Out of these 40,000 applicants, about 39571 applicants have been asked to get the estimate prepared and deposit the fees accordingly. Besides this, 19672 farmers have also deposited the estimated fee.
