Quota in private sector jobs **Govt to knock at SC door**

aryana Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal has said that his government would move an appeal in the Supreme Court against the recent Punjab and Haryana High Court order, striking down 75 per cent quota for locals in the private sector in the state. "Haryana Government will appeal in the Supreme Court regarding this matter. Being a welfare state, we will strongly plead on this matter in the apex court," said Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal, while addressing a press conference here on November 23, 2023.

The Chief Minister also announced the initiation of the process to withdraw FIRs registered against individuals who violated the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) issued by the Central and State Governments during the COVID-19 pandemic.

A total of 8,275 FIRs were registered for non-compliance with the norms, leading to the arrest of 14,127 individuals. Maximum 1030 FIRs were registered in Gurugram district followed by 814 FIRs in Jhajjar, 765 in Faridabad, 545 in Karnal and 646 in Rohtak. "The withdrawal of these FIRs will bring significant relief to the affected individuals," he added.

Announcing financial aid to the



family members of 11 people who lost their lives after the consumption of spurious liquor, the Haryana Chief Minister digitally disbursed an amount of more than Rs 38 lakh directly into the accounts of these families.

Age-wise provision

The compensation amount has been disbursed as per the age-wise provision mentioned in the DAYALU Yojana. Four families have received an amount of Rs 5 lakh and 6 families have received an amount of 6 lakh.

The Chief Minister also expressed deep regret over the unfortunate incident and reiterated the government's commitment to address the issue promptly and ensure justice for the family members. "Stringent measures have been implemented to tackle illegal activities associated with the production and distribution of spurious liquor.

Consequently, 35 individuals have been arrested, fines totalling Rs 2.51 crore have been levied, and 6 FIRs have been registered and L-13 licenses have been cancelled," shared Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal.

The Chief Minister also announced that the sanitation workers of civic bodies bagging a spot in the top 25 per cent category in the Swachh Survekshan will receive an incentive of Rs 12,000 annually.

Additionally, sanitation workers coming in the next 25 per cent category will also receive an annual incentive amount of Rs 9,000.

The Chief Minister said that in alignment with the vision of transforming India from a developing country to a developed nation by the year 2047 within the next 25 years, Prime Minister Mr Narendra Modi has initiated the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra, commencing from tribal areas.

He outlined a comprehensive 50-day program planned for Haryana, with the Yatra scheduled to run until January 26.

This extensive journey will cover 6,222 gram panchayats and 88 municipal bodies through 60-70 LED vehicles. About 5,000 to 7,000 programs will be organized during the Yatra.

Apex court hails stubble steps

CM thanks farmers for their support By Ajay Bhardwaj

s a two-judge bench of the Supreme Court came down heavily on the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)-led Punjab government for failing to control the incidents of stubble burning in the state and asked it to take a cue from the BJP-led Haryana government to control such incidents, it simply vindicated the Manohar Lal government's endeavours in addressing the pollution stemming from stubble burning.

Welcoming the observations of the Supreme Court Chief Minister Sh Manohar Lal expressed his gratitude to the farming community for responding positively to the initiatives mooted by the Haryana government to address the crisis.

Steep decline

The chief minister highlighted the collaborative efforts with farmers, which have resulted in substantial success in reducing incidents related to stubble burning.

The Chief Minister high-

lighted the relentless efforts undertaken by the government to combat stubble burning, resulting in a significant decline in incidents in Haryana compared to previous years.

In contrast, Punjab has experienced an alarming increase in such incidents. He provided statistics to underscore the positive trend in Haryana, stating that in 2021, there were 5993 reported incidents, which decreased to 3233 in 2022 and further reduced to 1986 in 2023.

This reflects a commendable 39 percent reduction in stubble burning incidents between 2022 and 2023 in Haryana. In stark contrast, Punjab reported a substantial increase in stubble burning incidents, reaching 31932 in the year 2023.

Haryana's comprehensive strategy includes both in-situ and ex-situ management, with a focus on categorizing villages into Red, Yellow, and Green zones based on active fire incidents. The state government is dedicated to providing Crop Residue Management (CRM) machines to farmers at a subsidy, with 19141 lakh machines al-

Checking damage before damage is done

Govt takes advance steps to meet threat of calamities, floods

R ising to action in advance to check damages caused by natural disasters like floods is what makes Haryana's 'Manohar Government' an altogether a different model of governance.

Given the fact that effective flood management is of paramount importance in safeguarding communities, infrastructure, and the environment, the Haryana government has granted in-principle approval for 604 new schemes.

These new projects with a total budget of Rs 1,205.89 crore were approved during the 55th meeting of the Haryana State Drought Relief and Flood Control Board, convened under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal here on October 30, 2023.

Robust strategies

The development assumes significance as floods, often triggered by intense rainfall, storm surges, or rapid snowmelt, result in widespread destruction, causing loss of life, displacements, and significant damage to homes, businesses, and agricultural lands.

By implementing robust flood management strategies such as the



construction of levees, dams, and reservoirs, as well as the development of early warning systems, communities can mitigate

the adverse effects of flooding. Sustainable land-use planning and the preservation of natural flood plains contribute to reducing the risk of floods and their associated consequences.

The majority of these schemes primarily focus on protection of Abadi, protection of agricultural land, procurement of flood machinery, reclamation of agricultural land, conservation and reuse of water and renovation or reconstruction of structures for smooth flow of drains. Deputy Chief Minister Mr Dushyant Chautala and Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister Mr JP Dalal were also present in the meeting. The new flood schemes approved included 77 for Yamunanagar, 42 for Sonipat, 67 for Jhajjar, 36 for Rohtak, 53 for Ambala, 43 for Kaithal, 31 for Kurukshetra, 16 for Hisar, 22 for Charkhi Dadri, 27 for Fatehabad, 20 for Karnal, 28 for Jind, 17 for Panipat, 15 for Bhiwani, 18 for Nuh, 5 each for Mahendergarh and Faridabad, 14 for Palwal, 42 for Panchkula, 10 for Sirsa and 3 each for Rewari and Gurugram.

Direction to DCs

During the meeting, the Chief Minister instructed all Deputy Commissioners, who participated in the meeting virtually, to collect requests from residents in their respective districts for the construction of dams to mitigate any flood risks.

They were further directed to collect resolutions in this regard from Panchayats and transmit them to the Headquarter through the Divisional Commissioners.

Regarding the desilting of canals, rivers, or drains, the Chief Minister proposed the establishment of a set standard for the depth at which desilting should occur to remove sand. The responsibility for desilting would fall to the Irrigation department up to a specified depth with the Mining Department taking over if the silt level is below that point.

The Chief Minister further instructed all Deputy Commissioners to ensure the expeditious implementation of all flood control schemes within a specified time frame.

He emphasized the importance of prioritizing water conservation and the reuse of rainwater. This approach not only addresses flood management but also contributes to groundwater recharge and the efficient utilization of water resources in arid regions, thereby promoting sustainable water management practices. Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal stressed the need for proactive measures to prevent any adverse consequences, as floods can lead to significant loss of both lives and property.

The meeting of Haryana State Drought Relief and Flood Control Board is now convened twice a year, ensuring that all flood-related initiatives are finalized well in advance. This meeting is being held three months earlier than the originally scheduled time, underscoring the government's commitment to early preparation and disaster prevention, he added.

An overview

Advisor to the Irrigation and Water Resources Department, Mr Devinder Singh provided an overview of the recent flood situation in the state. He said that as per report approximately 1.95 acres of land in 680 villages had been submerged by floodwaters.

The department is diligently working towards identifying and implementing sustainable, longlasting solutions to address this issue. To mitigate property and life losses, various schemes have been devised, primarily focusing on safeguarding residential areas.

Proactive flood management not only protects lives and property but also fosters resilience, ensuring that communities can recover more swiftly in the aftermath of such natural disasters.

Moreover, in the face of climate change and its potential to intensify extreme weather events, the importance of comprehensive flood management becomes increasingly evident in building a resilient and sustainable future.

n order to give a renewed impetus to expeditious disposal of drug-related cases the Haryana government proposes to set up four more fast track courts in the state. This would raise the total number of fast track courts to 12 as eight of them are already functional in Sirsa, Fatehabad, Ambala, Hisar, Kaithal, Karnal, Kurukshetra, and Panipat. The new courts are proposed to be set up in Gurugram, Rohtak, Faridabad, and Yamunanagar. While presiding over the 6th State-level Committee meeting of NARCO Coordination Centre, Haryana Chief Secretary Sanjeev Kaushal said that legal and IT consultants will be appointed under the Haryana Police Act 2007. This move aims at reinforcing the government's commitment to combat substance abuse effectively.

The CVO engages in intelligence collection related to corruption, sensitizing stakeholders, and promoting awareness against corrupt practices. Moreover, punitive vigilance, including spot inquiry and investigation into corruption allegations, is conducted, with reports submitted for the consideration of the disciplinary authority concerned.

Combat task force

Recently, Chief Minister Sh Manohar Lal had announced to constitute a new task force under the Nasha Mukt Haryana campaign. This task force would comprise members from all social and religious organizations, government representatives, police personnel, called 'Saathi' to curb the unlawful sale of pharmaceuticals.

In addition, the Inter-State Drug Secretariat has been established at Panchkula, and software 'Hawk' has been developed to keep a record of the database of illegal activities. On the occasion of International Day against drug abuse and illicit trafficking, the chief minister had called upon the Haryana Police to intensify their efforts and wage a resolute war against the menace of drugs in the state.

The Chief Minister also highlighted the success of 'Operation Dhwast' against drug peddlers offenses.

Additionally, the HSNCB achieved a major breakthrough with the seizure of a monumental 40 quintals of poppy husk, marking one of the largest-ever hauls facilitated through technological interventions, he added.

Building on the success of the state-level Cyclothon campaign, the Chief Secretary stressed the need to expand the Cyclothon campaign to all villages, blocks, and districts. He is also promoting e-sports in schools to educate students about the dangers of drugs.

Mr. Kaushal highlighted the need for Standard Operating Procedures to equip 15 district deaddiction centers with necessary health facilities and staff training. Efforts also include the identification of drug addicts for admission to centers, providing health services, and extending support to their dependent families.

The emphasis is on a comprehensive strategy involving medical professionals and psychiatrists to eradicate addiction from the state.

Financial help for accidental death, disability

The first DAYALU scheme seeks to provide financial assistance in case of death (natural and accidental) or permanent disability (caused by accident) suffered by a member of family having an annual income of less than Rs. 1.8 lakh verified by the Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) database.

The assistance would vary with the age of the person at the time of death or permanent disability.

Assistance under the scheme shall be made available to a beneficiary provided his family income is less than Rs 1.8 lakh per annum; he has family ID/Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) number; and should be between six and 60 years of age.

Any claim made under the scheme which has gone into effect from April 1, 2023, for death or disability prior to this date shall not be entertained. Assistance will be given only for death or permanent disability (caused by accident).

Amount of assistance

The scheme will provide assistance as mentioned below. The amount would vary depending on the age of the beneficiary:-

The applicant shall submit the following documents online with the claim: Death certificate in case of death; and in case of permanent disability permanent disability certificate from a medical authority as notified by the Govt. of India vide S.O 76(E) dated 04.01.2018 issued after 1st April, 2023 showing permanent disability 70% or above,

on account of any accident.

Such payment shall be made in the bank account registered in the PPP database or through Aadhaarbased seeded bank accounts. The data of bank account/Aadhaar number will also be taken from FIDR database and further the bank will transfer the same to the bank account/Aadhaar seeded account.

Assistance amount

In case of death, the assistance amount shall be paid. In case member of a family is deceased, assistance will be given to the head of the family below the age of 60 years. In case he is above 60, the eldest of the family member below the age of 60 will get the payment.

In case no elder family member/HOF is below the age of 60 years the family member immediately above the age of 60 years.

In case no family member is alive after the death in the family then no assistance will be paid. In case alive family members are below the age of 18 years, the assistance will be paid only at the time of any member attaining the age above 18 years.

In case of permanent disability, the assistance amount shall be paid to the beneficiary in his bank account registered in the PPP database or bank account linked to the Aadhaar number.

In case assistance is sanctioned by suppressing true information or making wrong claim or on the basis of wrong information given by the claimant in the claim form then the assistance amount would be recov-

Social security for businessmen too

This will benefit thousands of businessmen across Haryana. They too have been brought under the social security net by the Manohar Lal Government which has launched a scheme which makes them eligible for a compensation of Rs 5 lakh in case of accidental death or permanent disability.

Under the Mukhyamantri Samuhik Vyapari Niii Durghatna Yojana which has been notified, the beneficiaries will have to register themselves on an online portal developed by the Haryana Traders Welfare Board (HTWB) with an annual registration fee of Rs 10 per lakh. But there is a caveat. The beneficiaries should be eligible taxpayers registered under the GST Act, 2017, says the notification.

The Haryana Parivar Suraksha Nyas (HPSN), in association with the HTWB, will be the implementing agency of the scheme. The HTWB will transfer the funds collected through the registration charges to the HPSN.

Partnership firms, Hindu undivided family (HUF), proprietorship firms, limited liability partnership (LLP) and companies will also be eligible for benefit under the scheme.

In case of disability, while the registered beneficiary with 70% and above disability will be eligible for compensation, the spouse or legal heir will be the claimant in case of death of a beneficiary.

Any dispute arising out of the claim will be resolved by the district or sub-divisional grievance redress committee, with the ADC and the president of the district advisory committee of the HTWB as members, the notification adds.

rolled under any of the Central Government schemes namely, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY) & Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) and the payment of premium is reimbursed to him under the state scheme Mukhya Mantri Parivar Samridhi Yojana (MMPSY), the assistance under DAYALU shall take into consideration the assistance received by the beneficiary under PMJJBY or PMSBY as the case may be.

The second Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Antyodaya Parivar Suraksha Yojana (DAYALU-II) scheme has been designed to provide financial assistance ranging from Rs 1 to Rs 5 lakh to the residents of the state in case of death or permanent disability due to stray animals or dog bite. Assistance will vary with the age of the person at the time of accidental death/permanent disability. It has also been notified.

The compensation amount will be Rs 1 lakh in case the age of the victim is up to 12 years, Rs 2 lakh for those in 12-18 year age group, Rs 3 lakh in case of 18-25 year age group, Rs 5 lakh in case of 25-40 year age group and Rs 2 lakh in case the age of the person concerned is more than 40 years.

According to the notification, death caused by stray cows, bulls, oxen, donkey, mule, nilgai and buffalo or due to dog bites will be covered under the scheme. Permanent disability means 70 per cent or more disability. The benefit under the scheme will be available to all residents of Haryana having the Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) or family ID," it said.

PPP database

"The payment of assistance will be made only in the bank account registered in the PPP database or through bank accounts linked to the Aadhaar card. The data of the bank account/Aadhaar number will also be taken from the Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) database," it said.

The benefit of assistance under the scheme will be made available to all residents of Haryana having Family ID/Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) number.

The scheme will come into



force from the date of earlier notification in the official gazette, and any claim made under this scheme for the death/permanent disability prior to this date will not be entertained. The scheme will provide the below mentioned assistance which would vary depending on the age of the beneficiary:-

In order to establish the genuineness of the claim and identity of the claimant(s), the deciding authority may seek any further documents from the claimant(s), as he deems necessary, for settlement of the claim.

Such assistance payment shall be made in the bank account registered in the PPP database or through Aadhaar based seeded bank accounts. The data of bank account/Aadhaar number will also be taken from Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) database, and the bank will transfer the same to the bank account/Aadhaar seeded account.

In case of death, the assistance amount shall be paid

a) In case a member of family is deceased, assistance will be given to..

- In case the head is above 60 years, the eldest of the family member below the age of 60 years.

In case of permanent disability, the assistance amount shall be paid to the beneficiary in his bank account registered in the PPP database or bank account linked to the Aadhaar number.

If case assistance is sanctioned by suppressing true information or making wrong claim or on the basis of wrong information given by the claimant in the claim form, the assistance amount would be recovered alongwith interest @ 12% per annum.

Implementing agency

The Haryana Parivar Suraksha Nyas (HPSN) will be the implementing agency for the project with its chief executive officer (CEO) will be the overall in charge of the scheme. The detailed standard operating procedures (SOPs) are being issued, the notification said.

Rs 10 lakh for death in accident on duty

The cause of employees has always been close to the heart of the Chief Minister, Mr Manohar Lal. The state government has come up with the Mukhya Mantri Haryana Karamcharis Durghatna Suraksha Yojana (MMHKDSY) to provide them socio-financial security in case of accident or permanent disability.

The scheme seeks to extend financial relief to Group C & D Employees (only contractual) and safai karamcharis (only contractual) working in different departments, public sector enterprises, municipalities and autonomous bodies etc. in the event of accidental death/ permanent disability (caused by accident) while on duty.

The departments/organizations whose employees will be covered by the scheme will include Group C & D (involved in high risk job) in power – lineman and assistant lineman; UHBVN; DHBVN; HPGCL; HVPNL; Public Health (sewer man and sewer helper); Fire Department (driver & fireman); safai karamcharis in urban local bodies; Development & Panchayats Department. Under the scheme which has come into operation with effect from 21st May, 2023, assistance will be given only for accidental death/ permanent disability (caused by accident) while on duty.

In case of accidental death/ permanent disability (caused by accident), the beneficiaries will be given a assistance of Rs 10 lakh in case of Group C and D employees and Rs 5 lakh for Safai Karamcharis.

If the beneficiary receives any assistance/benefits from the concerned department, that amount will be deducted from the assistance amount of MMHKDSY.

Claim procedure

The concerned department/ organization must inform the Trust about the employee's accidental death/ permanent disability within thirty days of the death.

The beneficiary will submit the following documents iIn case of accidental death: Claim form signed by the claimant; family ID; police intimation/first information report (FIR)/DDR; postmortem report and death certificate In case of permanent the disability claim form must be signed by the claimant; Family ID; police intimation/first information report (FIR)/DDR.; Permanent disability certificate from medical authority as notified by Govt. of India vide S.O 76(E) dated 04.01.2018 issued after the scheme came into force showing permanent disability 70% or above, on account of any accident and hospital discharge summary (only if hospitalised)HPSN from time to time.

These tests have proven instrumental in identifying various ailments at an early stage, enabling prompt treatment and care. These numbers also proved that Manohar Sarkar has been successful in realizing the Antyodaya Arogya Varsh dream.

The cornerstone of this vision is the 'Nirogi Haryana' scheme, which was inaugurated by the President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, on November 29, 2022. The scheme's primary objective is to conduct free health check-ups for the people of the state once every two years.

The scheme commenced by encompassing Antyodaya families, with an initial focus on early detection and prevention.

The initiative hasn't merely stopped at early detection. Its scope is expanding, aiming to include private sector hospitals, nursing homes, and laboratories. This expansion is envisioned to accelerate health check-ups, making them more accessible to citizens across the state.

1.4 lakh elderly getting automated pension: CM

Aryana Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal said that his government has ensured that people get all the scheme benefits while sitting at home only, thus giving them a major relief from making numerous rounds of the government offices to submit applications and other documents.

He said that to realize this egovernance vision, Parivar Pehchan Patra has emerged as the most crucial document. In May 2022, the government linked the elderly pension with PPP, and since then, the pension of approximately 1.40 lakh elderly has been started automatically.

Currently, around 18,52,085 senior citizens are being provided with a sum of approximately Rs. 506.50 crores monthly in the state, shared the Chief Minister while interacting with the beneficiaries receiving old age pension automatically via audio conferencing under the CM Ki Vishesh Charcha on November 4, 2023.

Income limit up

The Chief Minister said that the state government has increased the income limit for old age pension to Rs 3 lakh annually from Rs 2 lakh to extend its benefit to more elderly individuals. In the future, once a person reaches the age of 60 and the combined income of a couple becomes Rs 3 lakh annually, their pension will begin automatically, subject only to the eligible person's consent. The government has increased the pension from Rs 2,500 monthly to Rs 2,750 since April 1, 2023, and now, from January 1, 2024, it has been further

increased to Rs 3,000.

He said that apart from the elderly pension, the government also provides pension benefits to widows, individuals suffering from serious illnesses, and persons with disabilities. Furthermore, the government has now initiated the provision of a monthly pension for widowers after the age of 40 and unmarried men between the ages of 45 and 60.

In this way, a total of 30 lakh people in the state are being given the benefit of a monthly pension. As a result, a significant part of the budget will be spent on pension facilities starting from January 2024, said Sh. Manohar Lal.

The state government has created a new plan for the elderly. It was announced in the budget of this fiscal year to launch a 'Prahari' scheme for seniors over 80 years old. According to the PPP data, there are around 3.30 lakh seniors over 80 years of age in the state, among which 3600 are living alone.

In the scheme, government employees visit these seniors personally once every two months to learn about their well-being. If any senior requires medical assistance, property security, or any other help, the relevant government department provides assistance. Furthermore under the 'Varishtha Naagrik Sewa Ashram Scheme', the elderly will be provided care in a Sewa Ashram where all facilities including healthcare for senior citizens, will be available under one roof.

t is an amazing outcome of sustained efforts of Chief Minister Mr Manohar Lal to ensure the well-being of poor people. Under the Central government's Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana, 15 lakh families in Haryana receive free annual treatment of Rs 5 lakh. Additionally, until November 2, around 11 lakh families were benefitting from the Chirayu scheme of the Haryana government.

During the recent Antyodaya Mahasammelan held in Karnal, Union Home and Cooperation Minister Mr Amit Shah announced the inclusion of 14 lakh new families in this scheme.
